

The goal is to identify and manage potential sources of contamination in the area which supplies water to the city wells. Our PLAN was developed locally with input from community residents, state, local, and federal resource staff, and APPROVED by the Minnesota Department of Health.



Unused, Unsealed Wells May Contaminate Your Drinking Water

- •Unused, unsealed wells may act as a conduit and allow surface water runoff, contaminated water, or improperly disposed waste to reach your drinking water supply.
- •Inspect wells regularly for cracks in the casing.
- •Make sure all well covers are securely in place.
- **◆**Do not allow surface water runoff to enter the well.
- **◆**To protect your drinking water, hire a licensed well contractor to seal all unused, unsealed wells.

Practices to help protect drinking water supplies. The City is working cooperatively with business owners to implement storm water Best Management

Steps YOU can take to protect your drinking water:

- *Properly dispose of hazardous waste such as insecticides, pesticides, paints, and other auto fluids. Don't pour them on the ground or into storm drains solvents, and used motor oil
- *Sweep up litter and debris from sidewalks, driveways, and parking lots, *Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly and in the recommend amounts. especially around storm drains.

- *Cover grease storage and dumpsters; keep them clean to avoid leaks.
- *Report any chemical spills to the local hazardous waste cleanup team
- *Don't over-water your lawn.
