KEEP FATS, OILS & GREASE Out Of Our Sewers

Fats, oils, and grease resulting from food preparation can build up in the sewer pipes and cause costly blockage and backups and sewage overflows to private and public property.

Tips to keep drains fat-free: Pour fats, oils, and grease into a container and store in the freezer, then put in the trash after it has hardened. Use paper towels to wipe greasy dishes before washing. Use sink strainers to catch food waste when washing.

If you are moving, please notify our office at 829-8726 at least a day in advance to have your meters read for your final bill. Please have your forwarding address ready to give to us. Also, if you are selling your property, we need the new owner's name when you call in to final your account.

BPU requires an application for service to be filled out if you are beginning service with us or transferring service in our service area. We will not read the meters until we have received the completed application.

TICK-BORNE ILLNESSES

The following diseases are the most common tick-borne illnesses found in Minnesota. If you are bitten by a tick. take quick action to remove it and watch for signs and symptoms of illness. If you begin to feel ill, tell your supervisor and visit a clinic as soon as possible.

Watch out ticks are tiny!


An infected tick must be attached for 24 to 48 hours to transmit Lyme Disease.

Within 30 days of working in a tick habitat, watch for:

- Bulls-eve shaped rash or multiple rashes
- Fever
- Chills
- Headache
- Muscle and joint pain
- Fatigue

Other symptoms that might appear include:

- Paralysis on one side of the
- Stiff neck
- Irregular heartbeat
- Dizziness and heart palpitations
- Persistent weakness and fatigue
- Weakness, numbness or pain in the arms and legs



An infected tick must be attached for 36 to 48 hours to transmit Anaplasmosis.

Within three weeks of working in a tick habitat, watch for:

- Fever above 102 degrees
- Severe headache
- Muscle aches
- Chills and shaking


Other symptoms that might appear include:

- Nausea
- Vomiting
- Loss of appetite
- Abdominal pain

Within nine weeks of working in a tick habitat, watch for:

- Fever
- Headache
- Loss of appetite
- General malaise
 - Other symptoms that might appear include:
 - High fever Chills Muscle aches
 - Nausea
 - Vomiting
